

# Parents Survey...

#### Survey completed by 75 parents.

 45 P6 parents (60%) • **30** P7 Parents (40%)





# Survey Results... 28% believe iPads have been beneficial 39% feel iPads have had a negative impact 33% are unsure



#### Key Takeaways...

- Some parents appreciate easier access to materials on Teams and independent research opportunities.
- Many express concerns over distractions, lack of clear learning benefits, and increased screen time.





#### What's worked well?

- Access to learning resources (Teams, research, online) homework submission).
- Independence Some children manage their work better. Support for learning difficulties – Useful for dyslexic
- students (voice-to-text).
- Educational apps Duolingo and GarageBand received positive feedback.
- Parental oversight Some parents like being able to see schoolwork.





#### Standout Remarks...

- "Voice-to-text has been a game-changer for my dyslexic child."
- "Predictive text has improved writing."
- "Convenient for submitting homework."
- "Skills improved because we already had an iPad at home."
- "GarageBand and Duolingo were valuable additions."
- "Having family-agreed rules early on helped avoid problems."

- Increased screen time Some children prioritise iPads over books, puzzles, and outdoor activities.
- Lack of clarity Parents unsure how iPads enhance learning.
- Difficulty controlling usage Parents struggle with setting limits.
- Social pressures Messaging apps create stress and drama.

Distractions – Access to games (especially Minecraft), YouTube,



### Standout Remarks...

- "Too much access to YouTube and games—should be restricted to learning apps."
- "It's now harder to limit screen time because they see the iPad as a right."
- "Messages between pupils are distracting and sometimes stressful."
- "School iPads should be only for structured learning, not a reward."
- "Children rush work just to play Minecraft."
- "Handwriting has become sloppier due to typing everything."
- "Parental control options are lacking—making rules harder to enforce."



#### **Common Recommendations...**

- Stronger restrictions on apps, especially gaming and messaging.
- Keep iPads in school rather than allowing them to go home.
- Clearer structure Ensure iPads are used for learning-focused activities.
- More parental involvement Transparency in how they are being used.
- Broader digital education More emphasis on skills like coding & research.





#### Standout Remarks...

- "Remove Minecraft immediately."
- "Messaging apps should be disabled completely."
- "iPads should be school-based, not for home use."
- "Better teacher supervision needed—students are often off-task."
- "Clear guidance on how iPads are supposed to improve learning."





### Final Conclusions...

- **Divided opinion:** Some parents see benefits, but many feel the negatives outweigh them.
- **Distraction vs Learning:** While iPads can aid learning, lack of oversight leads to misuse.
- **Parental concerns:** Many feel powerless in controlling iPad usage at home.
- Call for change: Parents want stricter controls, clearer educational purpose, and more teacher monitoring.
